Established in 2017, the Friends of Tide To Town is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization working to promote development and programming of the Tide To Town Urban Trail System.



Tide To Town is a beneficiary of the REACH (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health) grant awarded by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to the YMCA of Coastal Georgia and Healthy Savannah. This grant supports education, outreach, and development of Tide To Town, with a focus on access for low-wealth neighborhoods and schools.



Working with community partners – including the City of Savannah, Chatham County, the Savannah-Chatham County Public School System, Chatham Area Transit, neighborhood groups, and other stakeholders – Tide To Town will promote healthy environments to empower the human spirit.
